KUMQUAT REFRIGERATOR PIE

- 1 Can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 Eight ounce container Cool Whip topping
- 1/2 cup lemon juice
- 2/3 cup pureed fresh kumquats
- 1 baked 9-inch pie crust (or graham cracker crust)

Beat condensed milk and whipped topping. Add lemon juice and beat until thickened. Add pureed kumquats. Pour into pie crust. Chill in refrigerator for several hours before serving.

NOTE: Puree the kumquats and lemon juice together in the blender to keep the ingredients moving freely.

FLORAL ARRANGING PROGRAM

Rose Jackson, a NEFDGC member and DGC website sponsor, who is also owner of LaMee Florist, provided an entertaining hands-on program on use of floral arrangements in antique and other collectible glass and pottery items during the March 22, 2010 DGC program segment. Members paid a \$5.00 fee to participate in the event, and were given free reign in selecting their flowers for their personal arrangement. There was a total of \$80 collected that was donated back to the club's general fund by Rose & Ron Jackson.

Rose demonstrated the cutting and arranging techniques for various sizes and shapes of vessels, and techniques for using monochromatic color schemes, such as various sizes of forest green vases with white daisies.

Members enjoyed selecting their own fresh cut flowers to arrange in their floral vessels during the March flower arranging demonstration by Rose Jackson of LaMee Florist.

Sue Holley provided a display (right) of Depression Era through the 1960's glass floral vessels and a variety of flower frogs that can be used to help in art of floral arranging.
